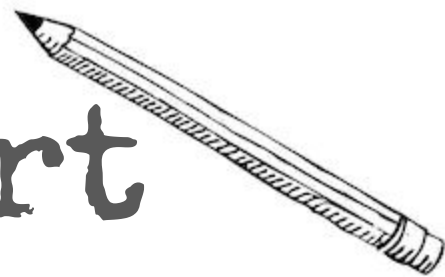

[2019-2020 Intermediate Course Syllabus]

This one-year discipline based course is designed for the student who has developed skills beyond the beginning level and wants to further develop their personal visual expression. It offers continuing opportunities to expand knowledge of historical and cultural developments to provide a basis for aesthetic judgments. A variety of media is used to foster visually literate and creative students. This course is open to those students who have passed a semester of Beginning Art.

Class Rules:

- **Respect** others, yourself, your surroundings and the supplies.
- **Try your best.** It takes patience and time to be great.

Course Goals: In this class we will learn...

1. To expand the use of the art vocabulary.
2. To visually analyze and express reflective concepts.
3. To use a greater variety of art media.
4. To continue to develop skill in safely working with tools and materials.
5. To further develop an understanding of the creative process.
6. To demonstrate the use of the elements of art, principles of design, and composition.
7. To recognize visual art from a variety of historical, cultural, and geographical areas.
8. To expand the use of appropriate multimedia technology as it relates to art.
9. To develop the technique of fine craftsmanship.
10. To demonstrate the relationships between the visual Arts, other arts, and disciplines outside of the arts.
11. To develop problem-solving and critical-thinking skills in exploring art criticism, aesthetics, and art production.
12. To develop a visual journal and sketchbook.
13. To investigate possible art careers.

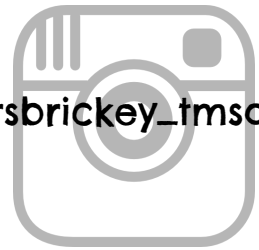

Grading: Grading is based on W.O.W.: Wonderful, Original, Works of Art

- Meeting project requirements (posted on board during project)
- Effort put into project. This will include growth from project to project.

Mrs. Brickey uses a letter grade scale (A, B, C, etc.). Rubrics will be used for student self-assessment as well as instructor assessment. Grading scale follows TMS and CCSD grading policy.

Due Dates:

- All artwork will be submitted on the assigned due date.
- If artwork is NOT complete, an incomplete (INC) grade will be given.
- Students can then take work home to finish and turn back in for re-grade
- Projects can be re-graded multiple times without penalty.
- All Incomplete work is due prior to the end of each quarter

Citizenship:

- Citizenship will appear in the gradebook as ungraded assignment.
- Comments will appear throughout quarter to track citizenship in a visible and transparent manner.

Late Work Policy:

All artwork will be turned in on assigned due date, even if the artwork is not finished. The artwork will be graded.

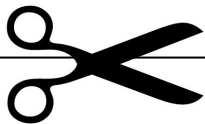
Incomplete or Unfinished Artwork can be finished during Mentorship or taken home to finish AFTER it has its first grade. It is the students responsibility to finish all work and remember to turn it in. Mrs. Brickey will not remind students.

ALL artwork is eligible for regrade during the assigned quarter. Once the quarter ends, the artworks grade stands.
